Benchmarking plus networking

- Formal benchmarking commenced in 2011 and continues; designed for those who had received their CAT data
- Growing interest in more informal networking by those who have not yet received their CAT data
- So we are supporting both activities

Rationale for benchmarking

- Similarities between organisations outweigh differences
- Benchmarking network is high value; professional connections based on trust, support and educational leadership
- Insights into future workforces; benchmarking using data gives insights into that data and a futures based workforce.
- Competitive advantage; use of CAT data can help forge a competitive advantage both for individual organisations and as a collective

Benefits of benchmarking

- Assists in extracting more value from data by comparing and reflecting on other's data.
- 2. Assists each organisation to improve their planning for workforce development
- Enables each organisation to enhance strategic planning, based on known and predicted staff capability.

Process

- Organisations from different States conduct discussions;
- by teleconference (usually about 1 -1 1/2 hours)
- Using suggested questions available for each CAT
- If possible a visit to one other benchmarking organisation for face to face discussions, or invite another benchmarking organisation to visit them

Parameters

- Agree with your paired organisation on confidentiality arrangements
- 2. Agree on aims and objectives
- 3. Agree on methodology for the meeting;
 - 1 Face to face
 - 2. Video/teleconference
 - 3. How many sessions

Not ready to benchmark yet?

- 1. Just starting a new CAT?
- 2. Have all the reports and not sure what the data is saying?
- 3. About to embark on a new CAT?
- 4. Two strategies that could assist
 - 1. Unpacking the CATs document outlines a process
 - 2. Touching base informally with someone who has done the CAT you are worrying about.

Supporting benchmarking plus networking

- Client feedback has persuaded us to expand the role so that we are supporting networking as well as benchmarking.
- This is particular popular for those who are not yet at the point of having data to benchmark; or people new to their role with the CATs.
